About The Role

The **Airport Operations Specialist (AOS3)** ensures airport operations are safe, secure, efficient, and effective. The AOS3 provides a wide variety of runway, structures, grounds, and equipment maintenance duties to various internal or external client groups. In the event of an emergency, the AOS3 performs emergency response duties to minimize damage to life and property.

Key Responsibilities

- Minimize damage to life and property in emergency situations by providing effective fire suppression activities in the event of an aircraft crash, aircraft fire or other emergency on Airport property or surrounding area and to provide first aid as required.
- Operate firefighting equipment to combat aircraft fires on or around airport property.
- Perform and/or support maintenance and construction activities that may require trade certification or journeyman proficiency for the following trades: carpentry, plumbing, roofing, painting, masonry, sheet metal, HVAC, and heavy-duty mechanic.
- Train and assist other employees.
- Complete computer and paper-based work orders, forms, and other reports as required.
- Work safely and actively towards creating and maintaining a safe and secure work environment by
 ensuring compliance with Occupational Health and Safety regulations, the Canada Labour Code, the
 airport's Safety Management System, Airport Security Program and other airport policies and
 procedures.
- Operate and maintain large airfield, runway and surface maintenance equipment
- Complete summer and winter airfield and grounds maintenance duties by using tools and operating equipment
- Communicate with stakeholders regarding site information and safety concerns
- Perform other assigned or related duties.



Qualifications

- Demonstrated commitment to safety as a priority.
- Minimum grade 12 diploma or equivalent
- Licenses and certificates to operate airport surface equipment
- Ability to organize and prioritize their workload in a fast paced and changing environment.
- Knowledge and experience in carpentry, plumbing, roofing, painting, masonry, sheet metal, HVAC, and heavy-duty mechanic.
- Have a good working knowledge of applicable legislation, regulations and company policies and procedures with respect to airport operations, maintenance, and emergency response.
- Working knowledge of computer applications including word processing, spreadsheets, databases, and maintenance management systems.
- Possess or be able to obtain a Canadian passport and be ability to travel to the United States for training, if required
- Able to obtain and maintain an Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting (ARFF) Certification recognized by Transport Canada.
- Possess and maintain a valid BC Class 3 driver's license with airbrake endorsement
- Ability to obtain and maintain an Aeronautical Radio Operators license and Prince George Airport Vehicle Operators permit
- Ability to obtain and maintain a Transport Canada Security Clearance (TSC) to comply with regulatory requirements as a condition of employment.

Hours of Work

Day Shift – 05:00-15:30 / Night Shift – 15:00-01:30

AOS3's are currently scheduled on a four (4) on, four (4) off rotation of ten (10) hours shifts, alternating between day and night shifts. This shift scheduled is based on an averaging of a 35-hour work week. There is a potential requirement to work alternative shifts and/or overtime based on operational needs.
